



The book in discussion was 'Remnants of a Separation: A History of the Partition through Material Memory' by a young artist and author Aanchal Malhotra. Four students Karuna, Phunsuk, Simran and Sukhbir presented the book reviews. A

Powerpoint presentation of photographs of the Partition of India was shown by Ishita along with short clips from the movies, 'Pinjar' and 'Garam Hawa' by Jatin and Aman Pratap respectively to showcase the ramifications of the Partition. History department teacher-in charge Dr. Richa Malhotra described Aanchal Malhotra's work as a riveting testimony of partition trauma woven with fine sensitivity and compelling emotionality and introduced the speaker. 
## A Voice of their Own: Women Identity and Writings in India (1919-2019) By Urvashi Butalia

The Dr S. Radhakrishnan Book Club of the Time Travellers, History Society of CVS organised the 4th Book Club Meet on 18 April 2019. The book in discussion was '\*\*Raseedi Ticket'\*, an autobiography of a prominent poetess, writer, essayist of Punjabi and Hindi literature, Amrita Pritam. This book is a saga of the trials and tribulations faced by her and how she broke the glass ceiling by her revolutionary and poignant writings on womanhood.

The event was graced by eminent author, activist and publisher, Ms. Urvashi Butalia who delivered an impactful and thought-provoking lecture titled, '\*A Voice of their Own: Women Identity and Writings in India (1919-2019)'.\* She narrated some unheard stories about fearless women who dared to go against the societal norms and patriarchal practices and published writings in vernacular languages. Ms Urvashi Butalia is the co-founder of India's first feminist publishing house, Kali for Women and now heads Zubaan, an imprint of Kali. She has a long history of involvement in the women's movement in India and writes and publishes widely on a range of issues associated with women and gender in India. Among her best known publications is the award winning oral history of Partition, The Other Side of Silence: Voices from the Partition of India. She is currently working on a number of other books and she is also Visiting Faculty at Ashoka University and at Vedica Scholars.

Our teacher-in-charge Dr Richa Malhotra welcomed the guest of honour and expressed her warmest gratitude to Ms. Urvashi Butalia who has been a faculty member of our college previously, for accepting our invitation. It was an illuminating session on the emancipation of women as well as those fearless women who championed this cause through their writings.

In addition, selected book reviews were presented by Suraj Kumar, Srishti Singh and Rama Ram. Signature poems of Amrita Pritam were recited by Payal Aggrawal, Sunny Kumar and Sarthak Joel Tunious. Sunny Kumar in prelude to his recitation of Amrita Pritam's poem made a brilliant speech in which he compared the radical spirit and activism of her times with the emerging independent identity of Indian women in contemporary times. Along with this, one of our faculty members Dr. Virendra Singh Bithoo recited his fascinating poem on the movements led by Ms Urvashi Butalia. There was also a beautiful PowerPoint on the life and times of Amrita Pritam as well on indian women writers, made by Ishita Gangal and the main poster of the event was designed beautifully by Fareeha Zubair. In the end, Dr Mrinmoyee Ray gave the vote of thanks to the speaker, faculty members and students and the next book, '\*The Argumentative Indian\* ' by Nobel laureate economist, Prof. Amartya Sen was given to the members for the 5th Book Club Meet.
